



# Crossing Atlantic Surprise party for golden wedding

ON Saturday evening, Eric and Kit Deane, of Halifax Close, Maidenhead, believed they were on their way to their son Michael's house, to celebrate his 17th wedding anniversary. To their sur-prise, they found themselves surrounded by friends and relations, celebrating their own golden wedding.

Mrs. Deane said: "It was such a well kept secret. We had no idea."

About 60 people crammed into 71 Cadwell Drive, Maidenhead, and Mr. Deane said: 'As people began to dance, the walls of the house were bursting at the seams."

Mr. and Mrs. Deanes' five grandchildren were present, the three youngest, Steve, Lucy and Clare, bearing banners saying 'Happy Golden Day.' Mrs. Deane said: "It is a day we will never forget." Their house is overflowing with flowers, presents and cards marking the occasion. The Deanes, who have lived in Maidenhead for 52 years, met while Mrs. Deane was working for Marks & Spencer. They both agreed

they "hit it off" from the moment they met, and within 15 months they were married at Maidenhead Register Office on April 19, 1936.

Mrs. Deane remembers the ceremony well. She said: "I was looking around at all the people, and in my ex-citement, knocked Eric on the nose with the brim of my hat ... that was the be-

ginning of our marriage." The reception was held at a friend's house in Fielding Rd, Maidenhead. They didn't have a honeymoon. Mrs. Deane said: "We couldn't afford it in those days. I only got paid 32s. 6d.

They led busy working lives. Mrs. Deane left Marks & Spencer to work for 19 years at a bakers in King St, Maidenhead, and then a ladies underwear store. She retired at the age of 72 and said: "I'd still be working now if I could get a job."

Mr. Deane was a self-employed carpenter, and retired five years ago. He still has a part-time job as a cleaner at Maidenhead Town Hall.
