**MAIDENHEAD BOROUGH POLICE.**  
 MONDAY, OCTOBER 22nd.  
 Before the Mayor (Mr. E. Norrith), Mr. C. W. Cox, Mr. H. J. Mount, Mr. J. Budden, Mr. H. G. Cooper, Mr. F. W. Porter, and Mr. T. G. Wright.  
**Special Constables.**  
 A further batch of special constables made the declaration to serve in the borough for another year.  
**Horses Found Straying.**  
*Henry Taylor, of Butler's Meadow, Harry Bull, of Belmont Stables, and Archibald White, of 22, High-street, were summoned for allowing their horses to stray on the highway. Taylor and White, who did not appear, were fined 5s. With 4s. costs. Bull appeared and pleaded not guilty.  
 In this case P.C. Miles said that he saw three horses straying at about 3 a.m. in the road near Cornwalles College. He had much difficulty in getting the animals to "The Greyhound."  
 Cross-examined by defendant, witness said that P.C. Ponsford assisted him.  
 P.C. Ponsford corroborated.  
 Defendant averred that the horses must have been wilfully driven into the highway by someone, as they were placed in a field which was enclosed by a sound fence and hedge. The gate was securely fastened.  
 One of the defendant's employees, named Blane, spoke to putting the horses in the field on the night previous. He secured the gate, but the morning he found that it had been lifted off its hinges and the horses were gone.  
 By Mr. Cox: It was certain that there was no gap either in the hedge or on the land opposite the gate.  
 The Magistrate's Clerk: Isn't it a fact that you sometimes turn horses out on the land opposite Colney-avenue?—Yes, but not for long.  
 Mr. Cox: Have you ever turned them into that land at night?—No, never.  
 The magistrates considered the case in private and on their return into court the Mayor said that from the evidence it seemed that some mischievous person had been playing a trick on defendant and they would dismiss the case.  
**No Light.**  
 For riding a bicycle without a light on the night of September 22, 1912, late of "The Hind Head," Touchen end, was fined 1s., with 10s. costs.  
 Defendant's excuse to P.C. Appleton was that as the night was so bright he did not think a light was necessary. There was no lamp attached to the machine.  
**The Wrong Collar.**  
 Arthur C. Green, of King-street, had been summoned for allowing his dog on the highway without a name and address engraved on the collar, on September 10th.  
 P.C. Sneath considered the case.  
 Defendant's explanation in a letter to the Clerk was that his boy had put the wrong collar on the dog after washing it.  
 A fine of 2s. 6d. was imposed.  
**56 out of 99.**  
 Emma Day, of 37, Cordwalles-road, was summoned for not sending her child Ernest to school. Miss Glover, School Attendance Officer, stated that the child had only attended school 56 times out of 99.  
 A letter from the defendant stated that she was out at work all day and left the sending of the child to her daughter.  
 The magistrates adjourned the case for a month to see if there was any improvement.  
**Sad.**  
 Mrs. Mary Quitch, a respectable-dressed woman, of Oxford, was charged with being drunk and incapable in West-road, Castle-hill, on Saturday night.  
 P.S. Holding spoke to finding prisoner lying in the road.  
 The Magistrate's Clerk stated that defendant was separated from her husband for being an habitual drunkard. There were many previous convictions against her for similar offences.  
 A constable was ordered to see prisoner out of the town.*
